Letter from Gus van den Brink, Executive Director



I'm not sure what season of the year slips by the fastest but I am thinking it is summer. It seems that spring came just yesterday and here we are in the middle of August. Just like summer our new fiscal year for Sertoma started July 1st and here we are half way through August. We are excited about this new fiscal year as we have worked hard to plan for it and make it a great year for all the individuals we support in our programs and services.

It is said that an organization is only as good as its staff. I think this is especially true for a service

organization like Sertoma Centre. We want the best qualified staff with a passion for our mission and I think we in most part, have succeeded to do this. One thing that made this a little easier is the efforts by the "They Deserve More" coalition and the State increasing our rates to allow for a \$0.50/hour pay increase for direct support professional staff. Although it is still not enough it has made recruiting and retaining quality staff a bit easier. With our FY 2018 budget year ending balanced, we were also in a position to give all staff a pay increase effective July 1st, something we could not accomplish the last two fiscal years.

So what do we have planned for the year that will help us be better at serving the individuals we support? Several things including, an additional staff position in our autism services program. The goal of this position is to further develop the program by enhancing current services through curriculum development, additional staff training, and staff support in implementing daily program services.

We are also excited about the second year of our Youth empowered for Success (YES) program. It has had a very successful start and we look forward to the high school students participating in more opportunities to be out in the community in trial work experiences, learning adventures, and activities.

In late fall we will be implementing new services in our DD/MI program. Services that previously were only available through our community mental health and counseling programs located in Matteson will be provided to individuals with a dual diagnosis of developmental disabilities and mental illness at our location on 127th street in Alsip.

We are also working to move the development of our new permanent supportive housing project in Orland Park closer to reality. The primary funding application has been submitted and within the next few months we believe we will see the project's funding approved. This 16 unit apartment building will double our capacity to provide independent housing for individuals with disabilities.

As you read this newsletter you will learn more about what is happening in our programs and services and ways you can participate in supporting individuals with disabilities through Sertoma Centre. If you have not done so already, please consider giving your support through a financial gift, participating in one of our fun events, or by volunteering. Know that your support it greatly needed, used effectively and much appreciated.

Jacque is a 7 year old black poodle who is a certified therapy as well as a grief therapy dog. This class is beneficial because most of the consumers don't have daily interactions with dogs or pets at their CILA homes or families homes. This class has taught consumers how to appropriately interact with a dog, what commands dogs can be taught, how dogs are helpful to people with disabilities, along with watching and learning how a certified therapy dog like Jacque was trained to bring happiness and peace to those who need it most. The consumers loved learning about all different types of dogs and the amazing things they can do!

CMHC Debuts New 24/7 Support Line

We rolled out our new 24/7 Elevated Consumer Support Line at Community Mental Health and Counseling in September. The Elevated Consumer Support (ECS) Line is an additional mental health resource now available to the consumers of the Community Mental Health and Counseling programs and services. The purpose of the ECS Line is to provide support to consumers in addressing immediate needs that do not necessarily require emergency

services. The goal is to encourage the use of coping skills and identify natural supports while working through challenging life events or to manage elevated symptoms associated with their mental illness. It is managed by mental health professionals currently employed with Community Mental Health and Counseling who are on call after hours, on weekends and on holidays. The consumers have been using the support line and there is a decrease in need for emergency services in the community.

Sertoma Centre Consumers Join 2018 Recovery and Empowerment Day

Did you know that nearly 10 million adults in America live with a serious mental illness? However, nearly 60% of these adults did not receive mental health services in the previous year due to stigma and/or lack of treatment resources. Consequently on May 17, 2018, eight CMHC consumers and 4 staff members took a 200 mile trip to Springfield in order to raise awareness and advocate for mental health services. This was CMHC's 3rd year taking a historic advocacy and empowerment trip to Springfield! During this year's trip, the group had the opportunity to take part in many interactive advocacy activities, including a mental health rally, dignity march, and several politician meetings.

Prior to embarking on this year's journey, the consumers worked very hard to draft their own unique recovery stories on beautiful, Sertoma branded advocacy postcards. In addition, the attending consumers created memorable and empowering posters that were utilized in the dignity march and rally. While meeting with their elected representatives, consumers were encouraged to share their own recovery stories and promote mental health treatment. In fact, all of the attending consumers did an amazing job of advocating for themselves and the bills associated with mental health services, with little to no encouragement from the attending staff members! After sharing their mental health recovery stories and meeting several Illinois politicians, consumers had an opportunity to tour their state capitol. This tour provided consumers with a first-hand look at the legislative process and the state capitol's rich history. The tour began in the Senate Chamber where the group was able to learn about the legislative process and voting. Following the tour of the House chambers, the group stopped at the three floors of the rotunda, where the tour guide pointed out various architectural features, as well as the historical significance of several paintings and statues. For many of the attending consumers, this was their first opportunity to explore and experience their state capitol.

Although stigma and overall mental health resources may not be dramatically improving from this advocacy trip; with dedication, perseverance, and determination, CMHC consumers were able to have their voices and recovery stories heard in Springfield! As John Wooden once said, "It's the little details that are vital. Little things make big things happen."
